

Supply List Pens, Watercolors, and Dr. Martin Watercolors Michelle Kogan

NOTE: You do not need to purchase all here. Select a few penholders; nibs; India ink; regular watercolors: primary colors and earth tones by Holbein, Winsor & Newton; a few bottles of Dr. Martin watercolorsprimaries: red, blue, yellow and a brown; a couple different papers. Add items as your budget allows. Find in your home a mixing tray and containers for water.

Dr. Martin Transparent Watercolors

List below are Transparent Dr. Martin Watercolors- they are highly concentrated– At Dick Blick look for Dr. Martin Radiant Concentrated Watercolor; on line look for Dr. Martin Synchromatic Transparent Watercolor: on Amazon or http://www.docmartins.com

•Select 1-2 blues; yellow, 1-2 reds; 1-2 browns my choice * below. Substitute a close color if one isn't available 3 from below yellow, blue, and red

Transparent Dr. Martin Watercolors:

These aren't lightfast, but are beautiful brilliant colors *Ultramarine Blue (cool blue) *Cerulean Blue or Turquoise Blue (warm blue) *Nile Green Chartreuse *Cadmium (this is yellow) Daffodil Yellow *Scarlet (warm red) or Carmine (slightly cooler red) *Van Dyke Brown (dark brown similar to sepia) *Light Brown (golden brown) Yellow Ochre (Similar to raw umber) *Medium Gray, Dark Gray *Burnt Sienna (reddish brown)

•Mixing Tray with edge: metal, plastic, butcher tray-or cookie sheet, plastic flat container

•2-3 Brushes: round watercolor brushes # 2, 4, 5, or larger, Japanese sumi brushes

• 1-3 Micron pens #02 or larger (try them out in the store)

• LePen Drawing Pen, Micron Brush Pen, or Pentel Brush Pen (this costs more but is worth it)

Dip Pens - holder & variety of nibs: A-5, A-2, B-6, C-4, make sure nibs fit penholder

Bamboo pen

- Black India Ink- Bombay Black Dr. Ph. Martin's waterproof or other permanent waterproof
- Water containers, paper towels/tissues, apron-watercolors and ink are permanent

Board for attaching paper: foam core, gator, drawing board

Drafting tape, Painters tape, and or Bulldog metal clips

Watercolor tubes/cakes if you have them and brushes

Sketchbook-small or paper for sketching your composition

Drawing pencils – Staedtler Mars #3b & Pencil Sharpener



Kneaded eraser
Reference materials and/or objects
Paper: Select 1– 2 sheet or 1 pad of coldpress
1-2 sheets 30 x 22 inches Fabriano Artistico #140 soft bright white or white 1 sheet 30 x 22 inches Fabriano Artistico #140 Hot press white You can also work in a sketchbook or other paper you bring in.
