Access to the EAC Open Studios

To support the EAC artist community while prioritizing everyone's wellbeing, the EAC will offer Open Studios for Summer Session 2 with several safety precautions in place.

The EAC will have a comprehensive COVID-19 policies and procedures document (closely following <u>Restore Illinois quidelines</u>) **posted on our website soon. Some aspects of the plan are included below:**

The EAC pledges to do the following each day:

- Significantly limit capacity of all studios by more than half the usual capacity.
- Limit the number of visitors in our building based on our square footage.
- Provide additional cleaning of all common areas and high touch surfaces, especially restrooms and door handles.
- Take daily temperatures of staff, and encourage staff to stay home if feeling unwell.
 - If a staff member has a temperature of 100.4°F or above, they will not be permitted to remain on site, <u>per Restore Illinois guidelines.</u>
- Require all who enter the EAC wear a cloth mask for the duration of their visit.
- Provide disinfecting wipes for all students to wipe down areas and surfaces they've touched inside the studio.

All students participating in Open Studio must:

- <u>Arrive and depart at their scheduled arrival and departure times no exceptions</u>. We suggest stopping work 15 minutes prior to scheduled end time to allow enough time for wiping down all surfaces/tools.
- Wear a cloth face mask at all times.
- Take their temperature upon entry using provided gloves, and share results with an EAC staff member.
 - Anyone with a temperature of 100.4°F or above will not be permitted to remain on site, <u>per Restore Illinois guidelines.</u>
- Maintain a 6' distance from others.
- Stay home if feeling unwell.
 - The EAC will waive its refund policy if students must skip a visit due to potential COVID-19 infection. Ask a staff member for more information.
- Wash hands with soap for at least 20 seconds before, during and after their visit to open studios.
- Bring own tools wherever possible. Avoid using community tools wherever possible.



• Use provided disinfecting wipes to disinfect handles, tools, and any surfaces touched in the studio.

How to Reserve Your Scheduled 3-Hour Weekly Time Slot

Students interested in registering for Open Studio will reserve for a day and time slot, which will be their assigned 3-hour time slot for the 6-week term. To support the EAC's efforts of social distancing and reducing our capacity, please note the following:

- Students cannot trade time slots with other students, but may register for additional time slots.
- If there are openings, it may be possible to prorate term if you wish to register after the first week of open studios.
- Time slots may be removed due to low or no enrollment. Registration at least 5 days before the start of the Open Studio time slot is recommended.
- The EAC will waive its refund policy if a student must miss Open Studio due to illness, but not due to other conflicts (e.g., planned vacation, appointment).
- EAC credit cannot be applied for this Open Studio offering, but can be applied for online classes or future in-person classes.
- Only students who have previously taken an in-person class in the EAC's department are eligible for that department's Open Studios.
