

Spiess-Ferris's figures are narrative bodies, telling stories of personal, spiritual and environmental crises.

SUSAN BEINER*

March 28 - May 3, 2020 Workshop: Saturday, March 28 (see page 28)

Inspired by 18th century European porcelain, Susan Beiner has used her mixed media ceramic pieces to explore and question the role of creation and technology in our modern world. As her most recent work focuses on the transition between organic to synthetic, she uses industrial materials such as plastic, rubber, and foam. She is currently an Assistant Professor of Art at Arizona State University. She received degrees from Rutgers University and the University of Michigan.

SUSAN SMITH TREES*

March 28 - May 3, 2020

Susan Smith Trees peels away, stretches, and tears the materials to create forms of rippled masses in raw, amorphous, flesh-like fragments. Her pieces are melted and stained with pigment, wrapped over rocks, marred with crevices and punctures, kneaded into limbs and organs, and rolled and pounded into lace-like figures. This manipulation of

materials drives her process allowing an unleashing of an inner landscape in a kind of physical exorcism that suggests the experience of the body as a gateway to transformation.

Morgan Craig believes that architectural structures acting as both repositories and as vehicles for memory profoundly influence culture and identity by providing a tangible framework through which facets of a society can be expressed.
