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

Through different pedagogical approaches, the EAC embraces critical thinking, creative problem-solving, experimentation, and fun! We focus on sharing new techniques and skills to jump-start beginners and enhance existing interests. The EAC is an inclusive space that values multiple perspectives and interpretations both in the classrooms and the galleries. **Come explore, experiment, and create this summer at the Evanston Art Center!***

WHAT TO BRING

THEMATIC GUIDE FOR CAMPS

AGES 4-5 & 6-8

Each week campers will explore various art projects following new and exciting themes! Although the weekly themes are the same for both age groups, the projects will vary and adapt to each age level. For campers joining us for the full day, projects will be modified during the afternoon session so they can continue to learn, play, and experiment! Note: A 30-minute lunch break is included at no additional cost for full-day campers.



CAMP CURRICULUM AGES 4-5

Each camp fosters material exploration, visual literacy, as well as, behavioral and emotional development. Camps will emphasize skill-building through learning, identifying, and creating shapes while exploring colors, forms, lines, and texture. Through each themed camp, students will develop their visual literacy by experimenting with various art forms including drawing, painting, collage/mixed media, sculpture, and printmaking.



CAMP CURRICULUM AGES 6-8

Through various projects, these camps emphasize skill-building through arts and visual literacy, text and writing, as well as, behavioral and emotional development. Following the thematic guide for each week, projects will include a wide variety of mediums and will experiment with various subject matters, such as landscapes, portraits or figures, observational artwork, printmaking, color mixing, and more!






REFUND & CANCELLATION POLICY

EAC staff must be notified when dropping a class. Note that not attending does not constitute an official withdrawal. The refund policy is as follows:

•Tuition refunded minus \$50 processing fee: if you drop a class costing \$100 or more and notify EAC registrar at least one week prior to the scheduled class start date.

•Tuition refunded minus \$25 processing fee: if you drop a class costing under \$100 and notify EAC registrar at least one week prior to the scheduled class start date.

•Tuition refunded minus processing fee equal to 50% of class fee if you notify EAC registrar less than one week prior to the scheduled class start date and up to the next working day after the first class has met.

•**No refunds are given for classes dropped beyond the next business day after the first class has met.**

•Classes without minimum enrollment will be cancelled 3 days before the first class and you will be notified. Full tuition will be refunded within three weeks.

•EAC does not offer prorated camps.
