ART STUDIO CAMP DESCRIPTIONS

ARCHITECTURE AND DESIGN

Architects and designers get their inspiration from many environments from nature to what already exists in our built environment. In this camp students look at examples of architecture and design in the community to find personal inspiration. The camp begins with looking and sketching and then goes into building. In year's past students have made complex tree house maquettes set in live branches scavenged from the area. This project allows students to think about personal habitats and dwellings i.e. what is a home, what should it look like, who is lives there, entrances and exits, windows and light, what climate will it be located, etc.?

ART & TECHNOLOGY: LASER ENGRAVING & DESIGN

This camp will combine art and technology to create uniquely designed projects on our laser engraver. Laser engraving takes advantage of a high power laser to etch the surface and cut through a variety of materials. During the camp, students will learn how to use the laser engraver, design and prepare files for print, and have the opportunity to cut, etch and engrave their designs onto wood and plastics. We'll cover a variety of 2D and 3D software that will let the students create a variety of objects, including keychains, signs, and 3D models.

ART & TECHNOLOGY: 3D MODELING AND PRINTING OBJECTS

This 3D printing camp will equip students with the knowledge of how to print their own small objects with the use of programs such as TinkerCad, Autodesk Print Studio, and possibly Sculptris. During the class, we will go over the parts of the 3D Printer and the elements of designing something for the printer. We will discuss our ideas as a class and we will individually explore ways in which students can create and print their own objects--the possibilities are endless!

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY

Learn about and make artistic photographs that go beyond the snapshot or the cell phone image. In this class, students are exposed to dark room processes and photograms to better understand what photography is. Students will then learn about composition, technique, and light. Students explore all of this by shooting portraits, landscapes, still life arrangements, and whatever subject matter they can dream up. Digital images will be imported into Lightroom software for minor touchups. Bring a digital camera and the camera instruction manual on the first day.

ELECTRONICS ENGINEERING WITH BREADBOARD CIRCUITS

Learn about real-world engineering with hands-on tinkering that challenges students to use their intelligence and creativity to apply the concepts being discussed. Problemsolving, innovation and experimentation take center stage as students take an authentic turn as young engineers. Breadboard circuits are a great way for the students to learn about real electronics components and circuit design. Students learn building circuits with LEDs, batteries, resistors, capacitors, transistors and Light Dependent Resistor. At the end of the course, students get to take home the breadboard projects.

FASHION: DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

Students will design, construct, and sew garments using traditional and non-traditional materials. This camp focuses on illustration and sketching techniques that help them to prototype ideas. Once ideas are sketched and approved, campers end up making 3 looks that they wear themselves in an EAC runway show on the last day of class (time TBD). Students also learn how to write about what they make. The basics of sewing are a big help in this camp, however no experience is necessary.

FILMMAKING

In this camp, youth explore a variety of filmmaking strategies and get opportunities to bring their own stories to life. Learn about video production, camera operation, editing, directing, acting, and writing. Students will use video cameras and Macintosh computers in this class. **Note: This camp meets all day, 9:00am-3:30pm.**

MULTI-ARTS CAMP

Multi-arts Camp is a skills-building and projects-based camp that exposes children to drawing, painting, assemblage, and ceramics with a focus on multi-culturalism and world art. Students are invited to sign up for multiple weeks. Projects vary by week.

GRAFFITI AND COMMUNITY MURALS

This class explores the history of graffiti in and around Chicago while giving students opportunities to explore their own characters and wild styles on paper. Attention is given to community graffiti murals and legal graffiti projects in our city and how they shape the aesthetics of our communities. By the middle of the week, youth begin working with non-toxic water-based spray paint indoors on cardboard. Weather permitting, students get to create a real aerosol piece outside at the Evanston Art Center on plywood by week's end.

MINECRAFT MODDING WITH JAVA

In this camp, students learn to program and write mods using Minecraft's source code of Java programming language to customize the game, build new recipes, armor and items for the game. The camp focuses on giving students a world where they don't have to worry about the survival part of Minecraft, but rather on the exciting design and building parts!

OBSERVATIONAL DRAWING

Coordinate your hand eye while mastering still life, landscapes, and portraiture. All skill levels are welcome. Students develop fundamental drawing skills and techniques in charcoal, pencil, pen, ink, and pastel. This class covers line, shapes, perspective, composition, shading, and light.

OBSERVATIONAL PAINTING

Take a blank canvas and fill it with a still life, landscape, or portrait. Using acrylic paints, students will work at the easel learning about color, perspective, and realistic rendering as they build a painting step-by-step. All skill levels are welcome. This class covers sketching, shapes, composition, color mixing, brush strokes, light, and dark.

WOODWORKING

Learn woodworking techniques and make objects with hand and power tools under direct supervision of the instructor e.g. hand saws, screw drivers, hammers, and nails. You will learn project layout and cutting, basic joiner, sanding, and finishing techniques like sanding and staining wood. No prior woodworking skills are necessary.

Visual Arts Camp: Ages 4-5

Each camp fosters material exploration, visual literacy, and behavioral and emotional development. Skill building; learning, identifying, and creating through shapes, colors, forms, and lines; literacy and writing; and art forms including drawing, painting, collage/mixed media, sculpture, and printmaking are emphasized.

Mixed-Media Arts Camp: Ages 6-8

Projects emphasize skill-building, arts and visual literacy, text and writing, and behavioral and emotional development. Subjects include landscapes, portraits or figures, observational artwork, and color mixing.

Art Studio Camp: Ages 9-11 & 12-14

In visual arts camps, students explore skill-building and techniques including proportion, angling, perspective, and composition, Elements of Art (line, form, shape, value), Principles of Design (pattern, contrast, balance) and Color Theory. Critical thinking and strategy, teamwork, solution-finding, hands-on experimentation and exploration are encouraged in technology camps.

DEMO:

SPLASH OR WATER CASTING

Casting is the process of pouring molten metal into a hollow mold or organic material. As the metal is cooling down, it takes shape of the void or space. Once the metal has solidified it is considered the cast object. We will be pouring molten metal into water to create a splash casting. This technique is an organic way to create a unique one of a kind cast object that can easily be turned into a piece of jewelry.

**To avoid paying the processing fee, students may elect to receive a full tuition credit for classes or workshops dropped seven days or more BEFORE the first session. Tuition credit will have an expiration date of one year from the date the class or workshop was dropped and must be used in full for EAC class and/or workshop tuition. After the credit is redeemed, no further refund options will be available.

Tuition credits are not redeemable for cash under any circumstances. Tuition credits may be transferred to another individual only with written notice. Our goal is to make our art programming accessible to all. Please ask about financial aid opportunities and free programs.

REGISTRATION PROCESS:

1) MAIL-IN & DROP-OFF & GO

Mail-in and Drop-off & Go registration are ongoing. They are processed in order of receipt. **Note:** We urge you to put down a second class choice, in case your first choice class is already filled. Many fill quickly.

2) PHONE-IN, WALK-IN

You can "phone-in" or "walk-in" to register. You may prefer this method if you want to know immediately which classes are available, which aren't, etc. (Mailin and drop-off registration methods still continue). Phone-in registration may be charged with a MasterCard, Visa or American Express credit card during the EAC's registration hours. (A \$5 service fee will be added to all credit card charges.)

3) ONLINE REGISTRATION

Some final, but very important details. Mail your registration form and payment to: EAC, 1717 Central Street, Evanston, IL 60201. Students may prefer payment by check to avoid the \$5 service charge attached to credit/debit cards transactions. Unless you are registering by phone, you must sign your registration form and your payment must be included with the registration. When registering by phone, your verbal agreement to EAC's policies and liability waiver are needed to complete the transaction.

CONFIRMATION

If you do not get into your first choice class(es), we will call you. (Online registrants will receive an email confirmation.)

PLEASE NOTE:

In order to register for adult classes, students must be 18 years of age. Younger students may petition the Director of Education for permission to enroll in an adult class or workshop. No one, including children of students, is allowed in the studios during class or studio time unless they are enrollees or have visitor permission from the Director of Education.

ACCESSIBILITY FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

Evanston Art Center is dedicated to making arts accessible to everyone. **Building Accessibility:** Our building is accessible to wheelchair-users and those who need to avoid stairs with power-assist doors, an elevator and accessible restrooms. **Course Accessibility:** We invite students with disabilities to reach out to us in advance. CLASS DISCOUNTS

Introduce a friend (first time student) to EAC classes and receive a 20% discount off the price of one class. EAC Registrar must be alerted when you are introducing a student to EAC classes <u>at the time of</u> <u>registration</u> in order to receive the discount. Please check the appropriate box on the registration form indicating that you are referring a new student or have been referred by an EAC student and write in that student's name. 20% refund will be issued to the referring student within 30 days after the referred student's first class meets. No discounts will be given for dropped or canceled classes.

REFUNDS

See schedule above. Students are responsible for notifying the EAC REGISTRAR that they wish to drop a class; **not attending class does not constitute an official withdrawal from courses or cancellation of tuition or fees. Notifying your teacher does not constitute an official withdrawal - you must notify the EAC Registrar.** There is no reduced or pro-rated tuition. There are no refunds or makeup classes for classes students miss. There are no exceptions to the EAC refund policy. Membership is non-refundable.

CANCELLATIONS

Classes are cancelled when enrollment minimums are not reached. **EAC encourages students to register early. Classes that do not meet enrollment minimums are cancelled three days before the first class, and students are notified by telephone. Full tuition will be refunded within three weeks.** The Art Center reserves the right to change instructors, class structure, or to discontinue any class without incurring obligations. If a student is unable to attend a class period for any reason, the Art Center is not responsible for providing any make-up. Not attending class does not constitute an official drop or withdrawal from courses or cancellation of tuition or fees.

MISSED CLASSES

A make-up week is scheduled at the end of each term in the event a class session is cancelled by the EAC or the instructor. Make-up week is considered part of the term, and no refunds will be given for unattended scheduled classes during this week. There are no refunds, credits or make-ups for any other class sessions that were held as scheduled and missed by the student (student "no-show").

CLASS / WORKSHOP SUPPLY LISTS

Those registering by mail, telephone or in person will receive a full or partial supply list along with the confirmation of enrollment, when a supply list is available. Online registrants should check the class course description on our website for supply list availability.

EVANSTON ART CENTER CLOSINGS

Classes will not be held on major national holidays or during extremely inclement weather. Generally, the Art Center follows the decisions of the District #65 public schools regarding weather related school closings. Classes falling on these days will be made up at the end of the term and will be coordinated between the faculty member and each class. Only the administration may cancel classes in case of inclement weather. Please check emergencyclosings.com.

POLICY CHANGES

The administration reserves the right to alter policies pertaining to courses, fees, and other notices in this catalog from time to time as deemed necessary for the proper functioning of the Art Center. All such policy changes will be approved by the Board of Trustees before action is taken. The administration also reserves the right to cancel classes and alter scheduling or staffing when circumstances warrant.

CODE OF CONDUCT

In order to provide students, members, visitors and staff with a safe and supportive educational environment, the Evanston Art Center has adopted a Code of Conduct. The Code of Conduct is printed on the reverse of your enrollment confirmation. Copies of the Code of Conduct are also available through the EAC Registrar or Director of Education. The Art Center reserves the right to refuse to retain any student in any course at any time without incurring obligations.

STUDIO TIME

Several departments offer studio time to current students who would like additional time to work in the EAC studios outside of class time. Studio time schedules are worked out at the beginning of each term. Studio time is included in class tuition for Ceramics, Figure Sculpture, Jewelry and Printmaking students.

YOUTH ARTS LATE PICK-UP FEES

Parents are responsible for picking their children up on time. The EAC cannot be responsible for students brought early or picked up late. A fee of \$10 per every five minutes will be assessed by credit card or by invoice.
