TOBY ZALLMAN

Toby Zallman is a Chicago artist whose art practice focuses on sculpture and drawing. In 2005, after becoming aware of how damaging our plastic and e-waste is to the environment, she changed her materials to incorporate recycled/repurposed materials in her sculpture as well as a source of visual inspiration for both the sculptures and drawings. She has used computer detritus, plastic bags, plastic bottles and solid plastic trash to create unique artworks that shed light on the environmental devastation caused by our culture of consumerism.

Zallman shows both locally and nationally. She was the recipient of several Illinois Arts Council grants, an Individual Artist Program Grant, City of Chicago's Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events (DCASE) and has had artist residencies at the MacDowell Colony, Yaddo and Ragdale.
