Youth & Opportunity United (Y.O.U.) is a youth development agency that provides academic, social, and emotional support for the needs of young people and their families within the Evanston community. EAC partners with Y.O.U. to provide after-school arts enrichment to area schools.






OVER THE RAINBOW (OTR)

Over the Rainbow is a Chicago non-profit dedicated to increasing the quality of life for individuals with physical disabilities through the creation of affordable, accessible, barrier-free housing solutions. EAC sends an instructor to OTR Evanston residence to provide a free monthly art class for adult residents with disabilities.

WALKER AND DEWEY ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

EAC holds weekly after-school art outreach programming for District 65 Schools at Walker and Dewey Elementary schools at significantly discounted prices.

EAC participates in annual community events such as Young Evanston Artists (YEA!) providing a forum for the appreciation, exhibition, and performance of art of aspiring Young Evanston Artists. 
OUR NONPROFIT MISSION
